The society was formed in 2004 with a core group of 26 founder members and has grown to a membership of about 700 members. The members of ISHKS have brought laurels to the country. They have extensively published research articles in National and International journals, have been invited as faculty for international meetings in US, Europe and the Far East and have even written chapters and books. They have all brought the standards of Indian Arthroplasty on a global platform.

ISHKS is committed to impart education to surgeons and bring in the latest technology for better treatment of our patients. Each of our annual conferences have been a great academic feast and a huge success. The 11th Annual conference to be held on 7,8 and 9th April at Leela Ambience , New Delhi will be even better with eight foreign eminent surgeons and approximately 50 seasoned Indian surgeons.

You will be happy to know that ISHKS took its own initiative to start the Indian Joint Registry and has to date 1,52,396 cases recorded in the register. Another 7,000 cases are part of the pilot study with North gate which is being conducted in 6 centres.

It is a matter of pride to inform you that ISHKS was the international guest society of the American Association of Hip & Knee Surgeons (AAHKS). At their annual meeting in Nov 2016 in Dallas I was felicitated on behalf of the society and was given a plaque by the AAHKS President. Dr. Vijay Kumar who is Associate Professor of Orthopaedics at AIIMS was awarded a 2 week fellowship completely funded by AAHKS. This was a great learning experience for him.

Another feather in our cap is that we were been awarded a 2 hour Instructional Course Lecture at the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS) Annual meeting to be held in March 2017 in San Diego. The ICL was entitled "Acetabular intelligence in hip Replacement Surgey". Dr. Vijay Bose talked on Small Dysplastic acetabulum, Dr. C.J.Thakkar on Fractured acetabulum, Dr. J.A. Pachore on Ankylosed acetabulum and I spoke on Osteoporotic acetabulum.

In the end I would like to express my deep sense of gratitude to the society for having faith in me. Serving ISHKS has been a joy and a great learning experience. I will continue to serve the society as its past president and I wish and pray that ISHKS continues to grow on the strong foundation laid by its previous presidents. I warmly welcome Dr. Rajesh Maniar as the incoming president of our society.








Highlights From ISHKS 2016 (10th annual Meeting-Chennai)

and interactions. We have galaxy of national and international faculty that have confirmed to attend the metting



ISHKS Registry Update


ISHKS Registry was started in 2006 with aim to collect data and generate an Indian Database for Arthroplasty. More than 150 members are actively participating in the contribution of registry and our effort should direct 90% of arthroplasty surgeon. Only then this registry would be considered viable and valid.

ISHKS registry has started collaboration with Northgate company who have great experience of maintaining registry in UK for last 12 yrs. Last one year registry data has been compiled by Northgate on pilot basis. Registry is likely to open online soon for all the arthroplasty surgeons across the country.


Out come of Registry:

We present here the Exclusive peek view of Registry data collected till now. The below data analysis from registry gives some very unique insights into Indian Arthroplasty scenario. The complete data was compiled by Dr. J.A. Pachore (ISHKS Registry Chair). From Oct 2006 to March 2017 a total of 1.52.396 cases were added to the database of ISHKS Registry.


Total Knee Replacement





Distribution of TKR Patterns in Registry










The patella was replaced in 43% while 57% had patella not replaced.

IJR - Pilot Data Analysis by NorthGate


Patella Tendon northgate Comparision with England and Wales joint registry




